Welcome to the Parish Church of St. John the Divine, Victoria. Our worship reflects our rootedness in the Anglican tradition, whilst drawing on liturgies that reflect the long history and heritage of our Christian faith. Please join in as you feel able, and enjoy the words, music and opportunity for prayer and to be a part of our community.

If our service seems unfamiliar, please follow the cues from our leaflet, the ministers leading the service and those around you. Most of our Sunday morning worship services have the Eucharist, or Holy Communion, at the heart of our worship – please feel free to join us, whatever your tradition, in the sharing of bread and wine, at the station nearest to where you are seated. Gluten free wafers are available at all stations: Please indicate if you need one.

Within the Anglican Church of Canada (under the advice of the Primate and the Chief Medical Officer for Canada) we would ask that bread is not dipped into the wine, as this has the potential to spread infection in a way that the sharing of the cup does not. If you would prefer not to share the cup then receiving only bread is considered 'full communion' (also known as 'Communion in One Kind').

If there is anything that you wish to talk about, please do take the opportunity to talk to the worship leaders, ministers and other members of the congregation following the service. If you wish to receive prayer for yourself or for another, there will be members of our Healing Prayer group in the south Quadra entrance who would be happy to pray with you as the Holy Communion is shared.

After our service we usually share coffee and an opportunity to get to know one another, in the Church Hall – through the door on the front left hand side. We have many visitors and newcomers here so please make yourself known to folks as you feel comfortable.

You are very welcome here. We don't always get it right; please let us know when we do, and when we don't. Please stay and be a part of our family, for however long you would like.

The October Special Monthly Envelope is Out of the Rain.

The Out of the Rain Youth Night Shelter is a community project, providing shelter to homeless youth during the coldest months of the year. A coalition of community agencies, faith-based organizations, businesses, and individual volunteers work together to provide space, professional support, and food for the shelter. The shelter rotates among host sites in the community. Out of the Rain volunteers support staff as helpers or cook hot meals. St. John's host the youth one night a week with an evening meal and breakfast, and we provide space for two other nights per week. In addition we usually donate approximately \$5,000 per year.



Out of the Rain News:

Our night shelter for homeless street kids **opens for the season tomorrow, Mon., Oct.15**th. We provide space in our Crypt for up to 30 youths on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday nights. Youth outreach workers stay the night supervising and giving help where needed. Our many volunteers take turns bringing a hot supper or something for breakfast. Others supply cookies, fruit or bread. We have a donation bin in the hallway near the Lounge and would greatly appreciate your donations of hot chocolate (the kind you mix with water), herbal tea in individual packs, peanut butter, ketchup, hot sauce, granola bars, warm socks, Kleenex packs, and chap sticks. We have been keeping homeless kids safe and warm during the cold winter weather over the past 20 years, thanks to your love and passion for those in need. We thank you for helping to keep this outreach alive!



Things to nourish our spiritual journey

"Two false images of God are particularly irresistible to many of us – mostly unconsciously. The first I'll designate as God the negotiator and the other, God the Santa Claus. Though we have fashioned both to serve our interests, they are each other's opposites. With one, we want to make advantageous deals. From the other, we want to get warm smiles and bagfuls of goodies. We run from one to the other. Some of their features are reminiscent of the God of Jesus Christ. But we've drawn these images of God mostly from two currents of the culture in which we swim – the current of hard and unforgiving economic realities, in which we exchange goods to maximize benefits, and the current of soft, even infantile, desires, in which we long to be showered with gifts simply because we exist."
