
The 4th Sunday in Lent

WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

THE BLESSING OF WATER

A short meditation is played by the organ.

Please turn to face the west end of the church.

Minister: Blessed are you, loving God, creator of the Universe,

All: For you have blessed your people with the gift of water.

As the minister pours water into the baptismal font the following is prayed:

Minister: Gracious God, you have made water. We give thanks for water as it brings life in every

place that it flows. We remember your promise of restful waters. We remember Jesus

calming the stormy waters.

All: For your water brings life.

As this water is blessed we recall that water is found in the essence of our lives. We recall that Jesus took his spittle mixed with dust and brought forth sight for one that was blind. We pray that our eyes are opened to your love and presence in our lives.

Minister: Blessed are you, loving God, creator of the Universe,

All: For you have blessed your people with the gift of water.

ENTRANCE PSALM 33:1-8

The refrain is repeated by all after the cantor at the beginning, and then sung by all after each set of verses.



Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous; it is good for the just to sing praises. Praise the Lord with the harp; play to him upon the psaltery and lyre. **Refrain**

Sing for him a new song; sound a fanfare with all your skill upon the trumpet. For the word of the Lord is right, and all his works are sure. *Refrain*

All: And also with you.


CONFESSION

When we injure others, you confront us in your love and call us to the paths of righteousness.

You stand with the weak, and those, broken and alone, whom you have always welcomed home, making the first last, and the last first.

Therefore we raise our voices with angels and archangels, forever praising you and singing:

Dominus Deus Sabaoth.

Loving and Holy One, recalling Christ's death and resurrection, we offer you these gifts, longing for the bread of tomorrow and the wine of the age to come.

Therefore we proclaim our hope.

All: Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life. Lord Jesus, come in glory.

Pour out your Spirit on these gifts that through them you may sustain us in our hunger for your peace. We hold before you all whose lives are marked by suffering, our sisters and brothers. When we are broken and cast aside, embrace us in your love.

All: Restore us, O God, let your face shine!

Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O Source of all life, now and for ever.
